SYMONDS, THOMAS MARTIN. Adm. pens. at St John's, May 19, 1814. B. Apr. 13, 1795, in the parish of St James, Bury St Edmunds. School, Bury St Edmunds. Matric. Michs. 1814; Scholar, 1814; B.A. 1818; M.A. 1821. Ord. deacon (Salisbury) June 6, 1819; priest (Peterb.) 1820; C. of Denford and Ringstead, Northants., 1819. C. of Elton, Hunts. R. of Bromeswell, Suffolk, 1828-43. R. of Adwick-le-Street, Yorks., 1843-59. Married, Apr. 23, 1819, Anne, dau. of Valentine Jelly. Died Apr. 23, 1859, aged 64. (*Bury St Edmunds Sch. List.; Clergy List.; Crockford; Northants. Clergy; G. Mag. 1840, ii. 88 and 1859, i. 652.*)

SYMONDS, THOMAS POWELL. Adm. pens. at St John's, Oct. 8, 1808. Of Herefordshire. [Eldest s. of the Rev. Joseph, deceased (St John's College, Oxford, 1781). R. of Dynder and Abbey Dore (and Charlotte Bamford). B. 1789.] Matric. and A.M. 1808; Scholar, 1808; B.A. 1813; M.A. 1816. Ord. deacon (Salisbury) May 31, 1812; priest (Hereford) July 18, 1813; C. of Hinton, Wadristol, Berks., 1812-13. C. of Foy, Heref., 1813-19. Succeeded his uncle, Thomas Powell Symonds, M.P., at Pengethly, Heref., 1819. Chaplain of the Union at Wigan, 1819-25. R. of Sellack, near Ross, Heref., 1826-9. Married, Apr. 1816, Elizabeth, dau. of Abraham Holden Turner, of Headon, Middlesex, and had issue. Died Jan. 27, 1869. (*Burke, L.G.; Walford, County Families; Clergy List.; The Register, i. 254.*)

SYMONDS, WILLIAM. Adm. pens. at CAIUS, Nov. 23, 1849. S. of Stephen, calico-printer, of Manchester. B. 1832 in Marylebone, London. Schools, Bowdon, Cheshire, Portsmouth, Warrington, London and Congleton Grammar. Matric. Michs. 1850; B.A. 1854; M.A. 1857. Ord. deacon (Manchester) 1856; priest (Canterbury) 1859; C. of St Simon's, Salford, 1856-8. C. of St John's, Craydon, 1858-61. C. of Chippenham, Wilts., 1861-4. C. of Alderley, Cheshire, 1864-7. C. of Turnham Green, Middlesex, 1867-70. R. of Greystoke, Cumberland, 1871-5. R. of Stockport, Cheshire, 1875-1919. Hon. Canon of Chester, 1886. Rural Dean of Stockport, 1888. Married, Maria Sainsbury. Died Mar. 15, 1919. Father of William N. (1892). (*Venn, ii. 292; Crockford.*)

SYMONDS, WILLIAM HENRY. Adm. pens. at QUEENS', Oct. 1880. Matric. Michs. 1880; B.A. 1884; M.A. 1926. Ord. deacon (York) 1883; priest, 1884; C. of Sale memorial Church, Dyer's Hill, Sheffield, 1883-4. C. of Idle, Yorks., 1885-90; V. there, 1890-3. V. of St Paul's, Derby, 1893-1921. R. of Little Cornard, Suffolk, 1921-34. Subsequently of Handsworth Wood, Birmingham. (*Crockford.*)

SYMONDS, WILLIAM NORTH. Adm. at CAIUS, Jan. 27, 1892. [Eldest] s. of the Rev. Canon William (1849), R. of Stockport (and Maria Sainsbury). B. [Feb. 2], 1872, at Brighton. School, Eton, Matric. Lent, 1892; B.A. 1895. Called to the Bar, Inner Temple, Jan. 26, 1898. On the Northern Circuit. M.B.E., 1929. Married Hilda Brownell, dau. of C. T. Drabble, of Sharston Hall, Northenden, Cheshire. Died Nov. 15, 1930, at Alderley Edge, Cheshire. (*Venn, ii. 523; Law Lists; Burke, O.B.E.; The Times, Nov. 17, 1930.*)

SYMONDS, WILLIAM SAMUEL. Adm. pens. (age 18) at CHRIST'S, Mar. 22, 1837. [Eldest] s. of William [J.P. and D.L.] of Elsdon, Heref. (and Mary Anne, dau. of Samuel Beale). B. [Dec. 13, 1818] in Herefordshire. School, Cheltenham College. Matric. Michs. 1837; B.A. 1842. Ord. deacon, 1841; priest (Worcester) Dec. 18, 1842. C. of Offenham, Worcs., 1842-5. R. (and Patron) of Pendock, 1845-57. J.P. for Worcs. F.G.S. Inherited Pendock Court from his mother. Married, 1849. Hyacinth Catherine, eldest dau. of Samuel Kent, of Upton-on-Severn, and had issue. Resided latterly at Sunningdale, Berks. Author, *Old Stones; Stones of the Valley; Old Bones; Records of the Rocks*, and two novels. Died Sept. 15, 1887, at Cheltenham; buried at Pendock. SYMONS, CHARLES JOHN FITZSIMON. Adm. pens. at St John's, June 6, 1882. [Elder] s. of Edwin Charles, Commander, R.N. (and Emily). B. Aug. 26, 1864, at Greenwich Hospital, Kent. School, Mannamead, Plymouth (Mr A. Pollard). Matric. Michs. 1882; B.A. 1886; M.A. 1913. Ord. deacon (Colchester, *Litt. dim. from London*) 1887; priest (Mid-China) 1892; Missionary (C.M.S.) at Ningpo, 1887-96; at Shanghai, 1896-1919; Secretary, C.M.S. (in dio. of Mid-China), 1900-5; in dio. of Chekiang, 1909-19; Sub-Dean of Holy Trinity Cathedral and Port Chaplain at Shanghai, 1919-20; Dean, 1920-8. Died Jan. 19, 1928, in Shanghai. SYMONS, EDWIN WILLIAM. Adm. sizar (age 29) at St John's, June 15, 1839; re-adm. pens., Oct. 12, 1839. [School, Ilminster.] Of Devon. Matric. Michs. 1839; B.A. 1843; M.A.

SYMONS, JOHN

1846. Ord. deacon (Heref., *Litt. dim. from Lichfield*) Apr. 9, 1843; priest (Lichfield) Dec. 24, 1843. P.C. of Cotmanhay, Derbs., 1846-58. Disappears from *Clergy List*, 1867.

SYMONS, THE REV. HENRY JOHN. LL.D. 1848, incorp. from Oxford, [and s. of the Rev. Jelinger (1772), of Hackney.] Matric. from St John's College, Oxford, July 1, 1799, age 18; B.A. (Oxford) 1803; M.A. (Oxford) 1808; B.C.L. and D.C.L. (Oxford) 1813. Minister at Upper Clapton Chapel, Middlesex, from 1810. Chaplain to the Forces in the Peninsular war; conducted the burial service of Sir John Moore at Corunna. Chaplain to the Duke of Kent and the Duke of Cambridge. V. of All Saints with St Martin's, Hereford, 1845-57. Married Frances, dau. of William Johnson and had issue. Died Mar. 22, 1857. Brother of Jelinger (1793). (*Al. Oxon.; Burke, L.G.; P. E. Towell.*)

SYMONS, HUGH JELLINGER. Adm. pens. (age 19) at JESUS, Oct. 1867. [and s. of the Rev. Edward Warwick] (Jelinger). (B.A., Durham) [V. of Great Doddington, Northants.] (and Hannah Birth, dau. of Thomas de Twambrook Glazebrook of New Brighton, Cheshire). B. [Mar. 14, 1848], at Meanwood, Leeds. School, Wellingborough (Dr H. Platt). Matric. Michs. 1867; B.A. 1900. Assistant Master at Stratheden House, Blaizeheathe, 1900-7; at Aysgarth School, Newton-le-Willows, 1908-11; at Beaumont House, Heronsgate, 1911; at Millmead, Shrewsbury, 1913-15; Head Master of Brunswick prep. School, Haywood Heath, 1917-32. Served in the Great War, 1914-18 (Capt., E. Yorks. Regt.; Major, Tank Corps; mentioned in despatches). Latterly of Westlands, Minehead, Somerset. Married, Dec. 31, 1928, Norah Lillian, dau. of Robert Eldridge, of Battle, Sussex. (*Burke, L.G., sub Saltau-Symons; Schoolmasters' Directories.*)

SYMONS, JELINGER. Adm. pens. (age 24) at St John's, July 10, 1772; a 'Ten-year man.' [and s. of William (and Bethia), dau. of the Rev.— Adams, V. of Blackawton, Devon.] B. [1768] in Beds. Matric. Michs. 1782; B.D. (*Sat. Lit.*) 1783. Ord. priest (Hereford) Oct. 1772; C. of St Nicholas, Hereford, 1772. R. of Whitburn, Durham, 1791-1810. C. of Hackney, Middlesex. Minister of Upper Clapton Chapel, Middlesex, 'for many years' and Minister of St John's, Hackney, until his death. Married Juliana, dau. of Theophilus Lane, of Poston Court, Heref. Author, *Sermons; Letters of Consolation and Advice from a father to his daughter on the death of her sister*, which ran through several editions, the 5th, in 1818, having a biographical account by his son, Jelinger. Died Feb. 12, 1810, at Clapton; buried Feb. 19, 1810, at Hackney. Father of the next and of Henry J. (1818). (*St John's Coll. Adm.*, iv. 503; Burke, L.G.; G. Mag., 1810, i. 190; H. M. Wood.)

SYMONS, JELINGER. Adm. pens. (age 17) at St John's, July 2, 1793. S. of the Rev. Jelinger (above), B.D., of Hackney (and Juliana, dau. of Theophilus Lane, of Poston Court, Heref.). B. at Low Leyton, Essex. Matric. Michs. 1793; Scholar, 1794; B.A. 1797; M.A. 1800. Ord. deacon (Durham) Jan. 29, 1799; priest, Sept. 1801; C. of Whitburn, Durham, 1799. V. of Monkland, Heref., 1808-51. C. of West Isley, Berks., 1809. Chaplain to the British residents in Boulogne, 1821. R. of Radnage, Bucks., 1833-51. J.P. for Hereford. Married, Jan. 7, 1805, Maria Henrietta, dau. of Henry Airey, of Snipeley, Co. Durham. Author, *Synopsis Plantarum Insulis Britannicis Indigenarum*. Died May 20, 1851, in London; buried May 25, at Radnage. Father of the next; brother of Henry J. (1818). (*Burke, L.G.; Durham Ord. Book; St John's Coll. SYMONS, JELINGER COOKSON. Adm. at TRINITY HALL, June 4, 1827. Of Berks. S. of the Rev. Jelinger (above), of Boulogne. [B. Aug. 27, 1809, at West Isley, Berks.] Matric. Michs. 1827. Migrated to Corpus Christi, Dec. 13, 1827; B.A. 1832. Commissioned by the Home Office, 1835, to enquire into the condition of hand-loom weavers and manufacturers, and travelled for this purpose in Lancashire, Scotland and Switzerland. Commissioner to inquire into the state of the mining population of the north. Called to the Bar, Middle Temple, June 9, 1843. On the Oxford Circuit. A Tithe Commissioner. Editor of the *Law Magazine*. Commissioner to collect information on the state of education in Wales, 1846. One of H.M. Inspectors of Schools, 1848-50. Married, June 16, 1845, Angelina, dau. of Edward Kendall, of Austrey, Warws., and had issue. Author, legal. Died Apr. 7, 1860, at Great Malvern. (*D.N.B.*; Burke, L.G.)

SYMONS, JOHN. Adm. pens. at Christ's, Nov. 1, 1819. Matric. Easter, 1820; Tancred Divinity Student, 1819. Kept 4 terms. [Probably the man of those names (not of Oxford), s. of John, of Trerethem, Bodmin, Cornwall; School, Blandell's, Tiverton, who was V. of Wilcot, Wills., 1823-40; died at Bath, Feb. or Mar., 1841. (*Peile, ii. 396; Foster, Index Eccles.; Clerical Guide; Clergy List; G. Mag., 1841, i. 324.*)]
