Message from the Party Leader, *Robin Swann MLA*

This will be our last weekly bulletin for the summer months. However we will update you if there are any major political developments.

What is clear is that there are choreographed political moves afoot. Whilst media attention was elsewhere on Thursday night, the UK Government and Irish Government sneaked out the announcement of a British Irish Intergovernmental Conference (BIIGC) to be held in London on 25 July. They've put the cart before the horse. This has been a long dormant structure but looks to have been revived as a sop to the Irish Government, Sinn Fein and the SDLP. Let's be absolutely clear. The BIIGC as defined in the Belfast Agreement can ONLY deal with non-devolved issues



under the three stranded approach and any departure from that would be totally unacceptable to the Ulster Unionist Party. The UK Government and especially those in the NIO need to remember that.

They should be focussing on having talks in Belfast to restore devolution. But perhaps the choreography on display is an indication that they intend to follow the path of previous failed talks processes where the Government sits on the sidelines, waiting outside the door as the DUP and Sinn Fein are left to their own devices. We shall see. We've set up a number of working groups to engage across the community. Last week we met the Orange Order to discuss a number of issues including legacy and the NIO consultation. And this week I attended the Pink News event in Parliament Buildings on Thursday night as part of an ongoing engagement with the LGBT community. I said in my speech that I would not stand by and allow unionism to become a by-word for intolerance and that I wanted to demonstrate that Unionism can be a home for everyone no matter what your sexual orientation is or indeed your religious affiliation. Unionism must be a comfortable home for everyone. And I intend to sell that message in the coming months. 
